CLASS SCHEDULE

Courses are offered on a semester system in a block schedule with four classes each day from 7:55 AM to 2:45 PM. Students must take seven blocks each semester.

ADVANCED COURSES & DUAL CREDIT COURSES



NDCL offers 14 dual-enrollment, college-level courses in partnership with the University of Mount Union.

These courses enable students to take credit-bearing college classes that also fulfill high school requirements. Dual credit courses are weighted with additional 0.5 quality points. NDCL also offers 9 Honors (H) courses and two Advanced Placement (AP) courses. AP/Honors courses are weighted with additional 0.5 quality points.
